# James "Jim" Walker KVCR RF Engineer





When KVCR listeners and **Empire Network TV viewers** think about their NPR and PBS stations, the people that come to mind first are likely program hosts and TV personalities. Many don't think about the important work of building and maintaining the physical plant which enables the broadcast of programs in the first place. In June the KVCR family bid a fond farewell to one of our own - a man who lived life to the fullest and spent all of his working hours behind the scenes...

James William Walker was born October 1, 1957. He joined the KVCR Engineering Team and our work family eleven years ago.

The popular KVCR Radio Frequency Engineer was a friend to everyone in our broadcast family and was always ready, day or night, to traverse the dirt and rock mountain road to our Box Springs transmitter site if a piece of equipment hiccupped, failed or simply required a bit of maintenance. Jim avoided office politics, was often the first to arrive at station birthday parties and other celebrations, and in most instances we would hear Jim before we ever saw him. Over the past couple of years, even while battling Acute Myeloid Leukemia, he was a key participant in countless planning meetings connected to the full upgrade of KVCR's TV and Radio transmission plant. Last October, while in remission following a debilitating round of chemotherapy and in the same month in which he celebrated his 60th birthday, Jim participated in the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's Light the Night Walk at Auto Club Speedway in Fontana.

Jim Walker passed away on Monday, July 23 at Loma Linda University Hospital where his valiant battle against AML began more than two years ago. We will be forever grateful for his dedication and work on KVCR's behalf, and on behalf of the bundreds of thousands of listeners and viewers of

hundreds of thousands of listeners and viewers of 91.9 KVCR, Empire Network TV and the FNX Channel. We shall miss his booming voice, his smile and his friendship.
