- What is the art of flint knapping?
- Why is it important to connect evidence to oral history?
- What have the indigenous people always known about this region?
- Why is oral history important?
- How would you have responded when you heard stories of the past linked to the artifacts you found?
- What stood out to you and why?
- Write Jen's travel journal, as she re-connects with her family and Chief Isadore
