Host Elyse Luray floors country music singer Clint Black with the information she uncovers about his turn-of-the-20th-century book of wanted posters. Then, can Eduardo Pagan link a chunk of molten metal to the B-25 Bomber that crashed into the Empire State Building in 1945? Did the History Detectives find a slide of Bettie Page, "Queen of Pinups," that somehow escaped the censorship of the 1950s? Finally, a six-foot metal bar tells the story behind the original iconic Hollywood sign.

After watching this episode, choose from the following questions and/or tasks to extend your learning

- How did Clint Black get the 20th-century book of wanted posters?
- Why did Clint's wife think he would enjoy this book?
- What does Clint Black want to know about the book?
- The book is known as a wanted scrapbook, how was its creator described?
- What changed to make a *wanted scrapbook* necessary as times changed?
- How is the book authenticated by the expert, what details verify its age?
- Who is the creator of the book? Who are his famous ancestors and famous friends?
- Where did the B-25 depart from? And where was the planned destination?
- Why did air-traffic controllers instruct the plane to fly to Newark Airport instead?
- The new flight plan took the plane over Manhattan, what were the pilots warned about?
- Why did the B-25 crash into the 79th floor of the Empire State Building?
- How far were scattered plane parts from the crash found?
- How many people lost their lives as a result of this crash?
- Who was Bettie Page?
- What was Bettie Page's nickname?
- What was Bettie Page known for? During what time period?
- Where was the uncensored slide found?
- Why did "Pin-up King" Irving Klaw destroy all his pin-up photos after appearing in Congress?
- How did this slide of Bettie Page escape being destroyed?







- Where is the Hollywood sign located?
- What does the original Hollywood sign say?
- What was the purpose of the original Hollywood sign?
- What does the sign say today?
- What does the sign signify today?
- Why do you think, given John T Taylor's ancestral history, that the job of chief of police was a good choice for him?
- Why do people from all over the world visit the Hollywood sign? Would you want to visit it? Why or why not?
- Create a chronological timeline of the events that the History Detective shares.
- If you have created other timelines, where do you see similarities? Where do you see large gaps of time?
- Identify 10 physical and behavior biometric identifiers that prove authentication.
- Research the history of the Hollywood sign and make a timeline.
 - tell its name at the time
 - what it was made of
 - provide it dimensions
 - tell its purpose
- Make a sign (letters or pictorial) depicting your family or town.
- As you drive through your town, notice the outdoor signage.
- Categorize the various signs you see.
- Determine the purpose for each category.
- What "catches your eye" with these outdoor signs?
- Make notes of signs that are "iconic" to our period of time.
- Re-design a sign- that you think could be improved- to better get passerby's attention.
