Nature: "Octopus: Making Contact"- 4th – 8th grade

After watching this episode, choose from the following questions and/or tasks to extend your learning

Question Box 1

- Prove at least two quotes of evidence that support the main claims or reasons.
- Choose 2-3 unfamiliar words for the program and define them.
- How does an octopus provide the inspiration for extraterrestrials in science fiction movies?
- How does this episode explain that cephalopods are intelligent and have their own personalities?
- As Alaskan professor raises a pet Octopus in his home, how does he explain that he can recognize faces?
- Explain how this octopus interacts with others? Why is this "odd" behavior for an asocial animal?
- How does "Heidi" play with Laurel, the professor's daughter?
- What are some of Heidi's abilities?
- Why is Professor Scheel more interested in our similarities with the octopus rather than our differences?


Question Box 2

Box 3 (Tasks)

- Compare and contrast the Octopus to a squid or nautilus
- Make a diagram of an Octopus and label its parts

Box 4 (Enrichment)

- Research a specific Octopus and write a poem or Haiku about it.
- Make a presentation that shows several Octopuses, include information about its common name, scientific name, its habitat, as well as a fun fact about the animal.
- "Octopuses followed a different evolutionary path, making them different from all other intelligent animals on this planet," what does Professor Scheel mean by this statement? Research to see if you can back his statement up with evidence. Record your findings in a report.

Box 5 (Extend/Real-Life)

- Blue Ringed Octopus is one of the most poisonous animals on earth. Discuss this organism and the role that it plays in its environment
- What do you know about Marine Biology? If this is something that interests you, what could you do to learn more about this career and what marine biologists actually do?
