<u>Uncovered in the Archives: "Riverside's Chinatowns"</u> - 4th thru 8th grade

Brad Pomerance uncovers the history of Riverside's Chinatowns. The City of Riverside would not have developed into the economic engine it has become without the ingenuity and know-how of Chinese immigrants who moved to the region in the late 1800s.

After watching this episode, choose from the following questions and/or tasks to extend your learning

Question Box 1

- Who were the first "Riversiders"?
- What kind of community did the first settlers to Riverside want to develop?
- What crops did the farmers that come from the east to Riverside plant? Which crops were successful? Which were not and why?
- What was John North's contribution to the development of Riverside?
- When and why did the Chinese come to Riverside? What were they doing before settling in Riverside?
- Why were the Chinese a "perfect fit" for the goals of developing this area?
- How did the Chinese help Riverside to become an "economic engine"?
- How are the Chinese honored for their contribution to Riverside?
- Who was Eliza Tibbets? What was her contribution to Riverside's "gold rush"?
- Other than farming employment, what Chinese business began to open up in what is now 7th Street-9th Street along Orange St.?
- What caused the Chinese to move to a new location?
- What was found in the "second" Chinatown?
- What debris was found after the Reconstruction Era of 1893?
