Xavier Riddle and the Secret Museum,

“I am Mark Twain / I am Abigail Adams”

4th – 8th grades.

Inspired by the best-selling kids book series, Ordinary People Change the World, by New York Times bestselling author Brad Meltzer and illustrator Christopher Eliopoulos, XAVIER RIDDLE AND THE SECRET MUSEUM follows the adventures of Xavier, Yadina and Brad as they tackle everyday problems by doing something extraordinary: traveling back in time to learn from real-life inspirational figures like Marie Curie, Harriet Tubman and Jackie Robinson when they were kids. Each adventure will help young viewers make the connection between the skills that made these historical figures heroes and those same qualities within themselves, helping them discover that they, too, can change the world.

In the first segment, Xavier is afraid he will be unable to perform his comedy show after he hurts his arm, but Mark Twain shows him that laughter can make hard things easier. Later, Abigail Adams helps Yadina realize that a missing color will not ruin her painting.

After watching this episode, choose from the following questions and/or tasks to extend your learning

Question Box 1

- Identify specific details in the TV Show that focus on the author’s purpose.
- What is this program “saying”? Cite evidence to support your analysis.
- Provide at least two quotes of evidence that support the main claims or reasons.
- What is the central idea (main claim) of the text? Is there a quote from the TV show that represents the author’s central idea?
- Choose 2-3 unfamiliar words for the program and define them.

- Now that it's over, what are my first thoughts about this overall project? Are they mostly positive or negative?
- How does laughter make things easier?

Box 3 (Tasks)

- Create a storyboard of the show.
- Research more about Mark Twain What did you learn?
- Research more about Abigail Adams. What did you find?
- Xavier's comedy show contained 3 jokes about food, 2 jokes about his dog and 5 jokes about bugs. What fraction of the jokes were about living things?
- If each joke took 3 minutes to tell, how long was the comedy show?

- Describe a time when laughter has made a hard thing easier?
- Why is it important that we can laugh at ourselves?
- What lesson was Abigail trying to teach Yadina about? Describe a time in your life when that lesson would have been applicable to you.
