After watching this episode, choose from the following questions and/or tasks to extend your learning

Question Box 1

- What does the team learn about the oldest quartzite quarries in North America?
- How does this evidence collected corroborate the oral history of this region?
- What is geomythology?
- What is the purpose of a Laser Ablation machine? Describe how it works?
- What is the art of flint knapping?
- Why is it important to connect evidence to oral history?
- What have the indigenous people always known about this region?
- Why is oral history important?

Question Box 2

- How would you have responded when you heard stories of the past linked to the artifacts you found?
- What stood out to you and why?

Box 3 (Tasks)

- Write Jen's travel journal, as she re-connects with her family and Chief Isadore Day at the Serpent River pow wow, Ontario.
