## 12:00pm <u>California Missions</u> – 4<sup>th</sup> thru 8<sup>th</sup> grade

Over the years countless artists have depicted the California Missions in drawings, paintings, etchings and photographs. Huell visits the Huntington Library, which has one of the largest collections of Mission art in the world. We'll also visit Luis Tur, who has made 19 of the 21 Mission models using nothing but pieces of junk.

## After watching this episode, choose from the following questions and/or tasks to extend your learning

- What is a museum curator?
- Why would a curator wear gloves to view artwork?
- Why are these drawings, postcards, photographs and paintings at the Huntington Library?
- What is the story about how Luis Tur's mission's project started?
- What does he do with his mission models?
- Look at Father Jerome Tupa's artwork and tell us your thoughts on how he depicts the missions? <u>http://deering-associates.com/anuncommonmission</u>
  - What do you like about his art?
  - What feelings does it inspire?
  - Why do you think his colors are so bright?
- Create a model of a new mission, San Bernardino. What features would it have? Draw it to scale? Can you use recycled materials?
- What would be similar to the original missions? What would be different to the original missions. (ELD) You may use academic words like these: "similar to, unlike, in the same way, in contrast, on the contrary, nevertheless, on the one hand, on the other hand..."
