The Roosevelts: An Intimate History, "Part 2: In the Arena"

The lives of the three great Roosevelts -- Teddy, Franklin and Eleanor -- are captured in this series. Ken Burns and producer, Paul Barnes describe the lives and times of these three American icons who influenced 20th century American history more than perhaps any other family. Through wars, revolutions, depressions, movements, the three led the country through what was called America's century. At times they had little in common but for one thing they always had in common . . . their ability, desire and conviction to lead.

In part two, murder brings Theodore Roosevelt to the presidency, but in the seven years that follow, he transforms the office and makes himself perhaps the best-loved of all the men who ever lived in the White House - battling corporate greed and building the Panama Canal, preserving American wilderness, carrying the message of American might around the world. FDR courts and weds Eleanor Roosevelt, the shy orphaned daughter of Theodore's alcoholic brother, Elliott. Together, they begin a family. Franklin enters a law firm, but when he is offered a chance to run for the New York state senate, he jumps at the chance.


After watching this episode, choose from the following questions and/or tasks to extend your learning

Question Box 1

- What evidence does the TV show director give to support his or her central idea?
- What is this program "saying"? Cite evidence to support your analysis.
- Which details support the key idea? Look for the who? What? When? Where? Why? How much? How many?
- What is the central message in this program? Explain?
- Like a good mystery, murder brings Theodore Roosevelt to the presidency. What events lead to Theodore's presidency?
- How did Roosevelt transform the office of the president?
- How did Theodore Roosevelt make himself perhaps "the best-loved of all the men who ever lived in the White House"?
- How did Theodore battle corporate greed?
- What significance did the building of the Panama Canal play in the Presidency of Theodore Roosevelt?
- How did preserving American wilderness carry the message of American might around the world?
- What events compel Franklin Roosevelt to run for the New York state senate?

Box 3 (Tasks)

- The land area of the contiguous 48 states is approximately 1.9 billion acres. Teddy Roosevelt set aside 200 million acres for national forests, reserves and wildlife refuges which was 5 times the amount his predecessors set aside combined. Use mathematics to justify the creation and preservation of these areas.
- Teddy Roosevelt claims that the Panama Canal was his greatest accomplishment as president. Justify or refute his claim using mathematics in your reasoning.
- Teddy Roosevelt had a reputation as a "trust buster". How could trust, or large industrial combinations threaten trade? Use mathematics to justify your reasoning.
